South Africa won Gold with Canada winning Bronze. Winning Silver in Cape Town along with the Bronze medal at the 2016 IBD World Championships and 4th in the 2014 Commonwealth Games were significant factors in this pairs combination being selected in the Para-Sport Team for the forthcoming Trans Tasman and 8 Nations events on the Gold Coast in May 2017.
